



## **President's Report for April 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022**

### **Welcome**

Thank you for coming tonight. I just wanted to say how grateful I am for your ongoing commitment to supporting the health and education of children and young people in Nepal, northern India, and Tibet.

TRAS exists because there are people here in Vancouver, and elsewhere in Canada, who want to help people in the Himalayas. Our approach is grassroots-based: instead of sending people overseas to do the work, we work with local non-profits based in the region, who know the most important needs on the ground.

### **Activities**

Fortunately, Covid appears to have receded as an issue. After the second wave of Covid in India and Nepal in spring 2021, there was a third wave peaking in January this year. With the third wave, the school closures were relatively brief.

The sponsorship program began in May 1964, with 13 sponsors. As of August 2022, TRAS sponsors have helped over 700 children. Approximately 90% of these children completed Grade 12, and many went on to higher studies. Currently, we are sponsoring 123 children, and have 18 children waiting for sponsors.
